Art Circle History

The inaugural meeting of Bolton Art Circle was on October 19 1945. In 1946 any person desiring membership of the Art Circle must be proposed and seconded by a member of the Art Circle and passed by the committee. There is no record of this ruling ever having been rescinded! Acceptance standards were high in those days. Here's one from 1948, "Mr. W. Dyke Carter A.R.C.A. (London) F.R.S.A. Prince Henry's Grammar School. Otley. was proposed by Mr. E. Dambergs and was deferred to the next meeting (where he was duly accepted).

In 1948 the Social Committee alone had 9 members and in 1968 there were "two secretaries for outdoor painting"

The Circle has been at Highfield since March 1994.

The member's 'Intimate Evening' has been held each May since 1990.

From 1972 -1990 the clubroom was in Atlas Mill on Chorley Old Road.

In 1973 the Circle had 285 members.
