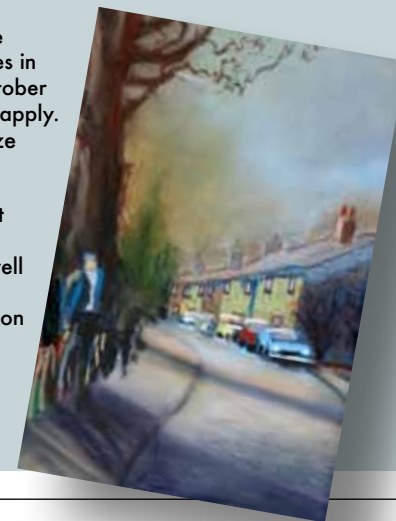


Secretary's Challenge
